Hitokoto card is a mechanism that enables the co-op to ask its members' opinions and requests through paper cards or internet, and then the co-op staff responds. This initiative is a part of interactions with co-op members.

Based on the policy of Board of Directors, these committees conduct various activities, such as welcome party for freshmen. store decoration and decision about its goods, mutual aid activities, sports activities and environmental activities, which are also based on the interest of co-op members. They realize requests from co-op members in various forms.

General Assembly (where members gather) and General Meeting of Representatives (where members elected as representatives gather) determine the year summary and policy, as well as financial results and budget of the co-op.

There are 97 university co-ops that adopted meal card and meal coupon as an initiative to support students to eat properly. It is a card charged with a certain amount of money, which can be used in dining halls. Some university co-ops report the content of meals to parents.

University co-op cooperates with public transportation to provide a service that allows students to use their transportation IC card at the dining hall. The amount charged can be converted and used as cafeteria point. A lot of university co-ops in Kanto and Koshinetsu districts use Cafeteria Pass.

Reading Marathon is an initiative to cultivate the reading habit of students. Currently, there are about 170 stores participating in this initiative with entries from 30.000 students. By writing impression of a book on a POP card and displaying the card on the store, circle of exchange among university students is spreading. Some university co-ops also publish book-review journal made by faculty, graduate students and university students.

Among new stores that were opened in 2013, we would like to introduce Tokyo University of Science Co-op and Kobe Pharmaceutical University Co-op.



University co-ops offer an opportunity to think about college life from admission until graduation, by holding "vision navigation seminars." to help students live their college life purposefully.

University co-ops offer various services to ensure that students can use their PCs free from anxiety for four years. University co-ops provide computer courses for beginners, sale and services of computers and peripherals, and setting special counters to deal with purchase using university budget.

University co-ops hold PC conference regularly with CIEC (Community for Innovation of Education and learning through Computers and communication networks) as a forum for exchange and learning of education and research using computers. * As of March 12, 2013, there are 853 individual members and 90 organization members

Relieving worries about job hunting through courses and seminars!

Job Hunting Assistance

University co-ops support enthusiastic students through courses and seminars. Senior students who are experienced in job hunting offer advice from their own experiences for junior students. University co-ops also hold seminars such as "Job Hunting Supplement School" to make students think about work and know the various industries. University co-ops also hold joint enterprise briefing.

University co-ops offer advice by senior students and orientation sessions about preparation of admission and college life!

Open Campus and Advice on Life as Freshmen

In open campus, students offer free drinks and written messages of support for high school students and give advice on college life through consultation corner. Senior students also give advice for new students who live alone on housing, goods, furniture and home electronics based on their own experience.

Orientation Sessions for Parents Before Admission

University co-ops hold orientation sessions for students with admission by recommendation, students with early admission and parents of students who will sit on exam. Senior students, faculty members and co-op staff provide guidance on various things regarding preparation of college life, including living alone, textbooks, teaching materials and computers.

The Great East Japan Earthquake Reconstruction Assistance Activities has been carried out for 34 times since March 11, 2011. A total of 955 students were involved in various activities, such as learning assistance for children and debris disposal. The activities are also being continued in 2014.

Global activities! Strengthening Cooperation with Co-operatives in the World

Co-operatives in the World NFUCA joined International Co-operative Alliance (ICA), the world's largest NGO since 2001, in order to strengthen cooperation with cooperatives in the world. In 2013, together with ICA Committee on University/Campus Co-operatives in the Asia and Pacific and Korea Univer-

sity Co-operative Federation, we held a workshop in South Korea.

* ICA (International Co-operative Alliance) is made up of 269 members and more than 1 billion individual members from 94 countries.

NFUCA collect data from more than 20,000 college students every year to investigate the actual condition of them.

Survey on Student Life Condition has been carried out every year with more than 20,000 college students as the respondents. This survey draws attention from the community since it has been carried out for 48 times and can provide insight on the current situation of students as well as the changes. NFUCA also conduct Survey on Freshmen Targeting Their Parents and Survey on Graduate Student Life Condition.

Outline and Operation of NFUCA

National Federation of University Co-operative Associations (NFUCA) has 220 university co-op members and more than 1.5 million individual members (students, graduate students and faculty). They invest by buying one share per member, use products and services of the co-op and operate the co-op.



Articles of Incorporation was made in accordance with the actual situation of each co-op with reference to the example of articles of incorporation designed by Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare.

* Consumer Co-operatives Act was amended drastically in May 2007 after 59 years, and the revised act was enforced since April 2008.
