- Survey method:** Web-based survey

- Period:** Wed, May 20 – Sat, May 30, 2020
- Number of responses:** Undergraduate students: 14,624 responses
(of which 7,573 respondents responded in April survey)

 - ✓ The representativeness of the survey results cannot be determined, e.g., some universities or grades (academic year) have a high number of responses.
