

About the questionnaire

Survey method: Web-based survey

Subject: Undergraduate and graduate students

Period: Mon, July 20 – Thu, July 30, 2020

Number of responses: Undergraduate students: 9,086 responses

Notes on the survey results:

- ✓ Possible non-student responses due to anonymity, multiple responses, or inappropriate responses.
- ✓ The representativeness of the survey results cannot be determined, e.g., some universities or grades (academic year) have a high number of responses.



I'm scared, but I can't live without working.



It's hard to get a part-time job, so the money I've been saving is quickly diminishing.



I'm afraid to work because of the risk of infection, but if I don't work, I won't have any income.



I had been working three part-time jobs, but now they closed their business. To make the same amount of money, I have to work at nightlife district.



Nowhere is this going to save the students, right?



I only have my mother. It's hard for me because my mother talks to me every day about quitting university.



Many of the student benefits are given to those who live separately from their parents. Students who live with their parents like me are being ignored.



Students are not eligible for government's support because their income has not been drastically reduced. It's so unfair.



There's too much work to do. It's not learning, it's working.



The university doesn't do the class properly, but the assignments are massive. Only the tests are face-to-face meeting.



I'm holed up in my room all the time, so I don't talk to my family as much. I get stressed out.



I don't think the faculty members are able to understand the current situation of the students.



I feel so helpless that I can't think or act.



The large volume of assignments prevents me from devoting time to take qualifications and job preparation.



The companies that I wanted to apply to have stopped hiring fresh graduates simultaneously.



Some people had their job offer cancelled and chose to go on to higher education because they had no choice.



Does the government think the priority for university below travel?



Only university students have to endure it. We want to take face-to-face classes, see our friends and go out.



Why is the government promoting travel through GoTo campaign, but we are restricted from entering campus?



Elementary, middle and high schools are conducting face-to-face classes. The mass media is broadcasting about clusters in nightlife district, but there are no obligation to close the business. Why should university students continue to take the online classes under the state of emergency?
